The ezICHRA portal will send you an email on November 7th announcing the beginning of Open Enrollment. There will be a deep link to your personal portal in the email.

All employees should finalize their renewal, new plan selection, report their Medicare premiums, and/or waive coverage in the ezICHRA portal, even if the carrier says if you want to renew you do not have to do anything.

Your current plan should be mapped in the portal for you to quickly renew your plan, if it is available. Should you wish to look for a new plan or waive, you will have that option as well.

The ezICHRA portal will send you email notifications until you have completed your Open Enrollment or the Open Enrollment window closes.

National Disability Employment Awareness Month

With October having been National Disability Employment
Awareness Month, Supernova Services has a lot to be proud of in
raising awareness and providing opportunities for individuals with
disabilities to find, master and maintain employment. While the
program continues to grow rapidly with consistent referrals and all of
the moving parts that it takes to keep a program like this running, it
is important to step back and reflect on the impact we are able to
have on the lives of those that we support.

Over the last 25 years I have seen an immense shift in the focus, acceptance and support from the community when it comes to our individuals working. Historically, stigma has played a large role in the marginalization of people in the population we support; People were confused by what they did not understand. As a system, we listened when our individuals told us that they wanted to hold jobs in their communities and pushed back against the stigma. We became creative to open opportunities for our individuals to get a chance to become a part of their communities through work. We cheered when the Governor declared Pennsylvania an "Employment First" state. We pushed and challenged ourselves to keep the momentum moving and create programming that would open doors for our individuals to obtain real-world training, to earn a paycheck and show that our individuals are capable of a career and a life in their community.

While stigma has decreased, it has not disappeared: Ask any good Job Developer what the number 1 rule is and they will tell you, "Get comfortable with being told no", while working with the community. At Supernova, we don't accept that as an answer. We know that by taking the time to learn the skills and interests of our individuals, what motivates them, that we are able to help them on their path to employment.

While October is the month where we recognize awareness for individuals with disabilities working in their communities, we celebrate them every day. The walls that have been broken down over the past decades are a direct result of the individuals that we are privileged enough to support, in truly believing that they wanted to be a part of their communities and employment plays a role in that inclusion.

RECULAR ATION

GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, October 2025 marks the 80th anniversary of the annual National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM), which focuses on education around disability employment issues, the importance of inclusive policies and practices, and celebrates the many and varied ways America's workers with disabilities participate in the workforce; and

WHEREAS, in 1945, NDEAM began as a week, recognizing solely people with physical disabilities, however, in 1988, Congress designated a full month for disability employment awareness each year and expanded its scope to include people with all kinds of disabilities; and

WHEREAS, as an Employment First state, Pennsylvania considers Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE) to be the first consideration and preferred outcome of publicly funded education, training, and employment related services, and Act 36 of 2018 created the Governor's Cabinet for People with Disabilities and the Employment First Oversight Commission to ensure implementation of this policy; and

WHEREAS, nearly 76,500 Pennsylvanians with a disability currently receive services through the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) and earn about \$19 per hour, and with First Lady Lori Shapiro's leadership guidance and support, employers like Sheetz and Wawa are partnering with OVR to expand access to good-paying jobs for people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, the Commonwealth secured \$354.8 million in federal and state funding to provide more resources for home and community-based service providers, including \$280 million to help raise wages for direct support professionals (DSP) who care for Pennsylvanians and \$74.8 million to begin the process of clearing the emergency waiting list for these vital services; and

WHEREAS, for the first time ever, after this historic commitment, more than 40,000 Pennsylvanians with ID/A are getting the services they need and the adult emergency wait list for services is down 28 percent over the last year; DSP wages are up six percent at \$17.85 per hour; and DSP vacancies are down 14 percent—the lowest since 2015; and

WHEREAS, this year's theme of "Celebrating Value and Talent" underpins the skills and contributions that people with disabilities bring to the workplace and upholds the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's steadfast commitment to working alongside advocates, providers, and community partners to strengthen the care workforce, make sure every Pennsylvanian can live with dignity, independence, and respect, and increase access to high-quality, good-paying jobs for all Pennsylvanians, including Pennsylvanians with disabilities, every month of the year.

THEREFORE, I, Josh Shapiro, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby proclaim October 2025 to be

NATIONAL DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT AWARENESS MONTH

I encourage all Pennsylvanians to recognize that workplaces that include and embrace all people, including people with disabilities, are key to creating an equitable community and society as well as a robust and vibrant economy.

YMCA Board Member, Marc Bellora, was at conference listening to a presentation by our Community Director, Aaron Wrubleski, and after that presentation, the rest as they say is history. Marc reached out to us about bringing Supernova's Employment Program to the Mon Valley. The Mon Valley YMCA has been instrumental in getting Supernova's Employment Specialists and Individuals a place where they can learn new and different skill sets that will allow our individuals the opportunity to build and try different types of jobs from janitorial, to landscaping. Angel Gulick, the Director of Communications, and her team have thoroughly enjoyed having our specialists and individuals there every day to help with the day-to-day maintenance and cleanliness of the facilities.

The History of the Mon Valley YMCA in the area goes back as far as the 1960's. In the mid 1960's, the Greater Charleroi YMCA and The Monongahela City YMCA merged to form the Mon Valley YMCA and began programming on land donated to the organization in Carroll Township, Pennsylvania. In 1968, the first structure was dedicated on the property at 101 Taylor Run Road, which was the outdoor pool. This, along with a bus on property which doubled as an office, allowed the Mon Valley YMCA to serve children through its summer camp program.

In the early 1970's, the first building was established which housed some offices and the activity hall. Throughout the rest of the 1970's, some additional land was donated to the YMCA that was adjacent to the existing property at 101 Taylor Run Road. In 1986, an expansion of the original building opened which contained the gymnasium, racquetball courts, and indoor pool and additional meeting spaces. In 2004, a second expansion was opened which contained the CFS Bank Wellness Center and Lee Supply Child Learning Center. Additionally, renovations occurred in 2013 and 2022:

- Serve over 4000 membership units and 6000 members a year.
- Over 800 people walk through our doors each day.
- 295 children served in preschool and childcare programs.

This month our Cooking Corner whipped up some healthy and creamy Mac & Cheese! This wholesome-savory dish is the perfect meal to get in the spirit of Thanksgiving, and now you can enjoy it too!

Ingredients/Seasonings:

Low Fat or Fat Free Cottage Cheese Cheese Powder Protein Pasta or Carbe Diem Low Carb Pasta Milk Seasonings of Choice

Instructions:

- 1. Boil pasta
- 2. In a large bowl, add the tub of cottage to a blender, or a bowl and blend with an immersion blender.
- 3. Add splashes of milk to thin it out and blend again; Not too much as you want it thick like creamy mac and cheese.
- 4. Add 2 tablespoons of cheese powder to create a light orange color.
- 5. Add to pre-boiled pasta and heat LOW & SLOW, Too hot and fast will make the cottage cheese separate.
- 6. Once warmed, serve and enjoy!















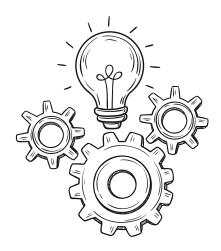
