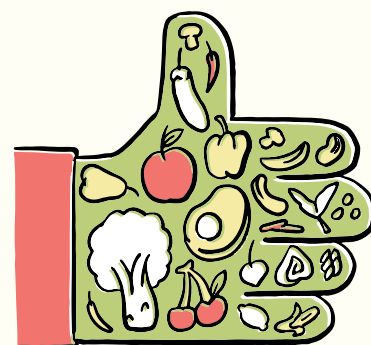
National Wellness Month

Employment Program Spotlight - City of Washington Blighted Properties Project

The City of Washington has been a champion of providing individuals with disabilities with opportunities to work and train on their job skills, throughout changes in administration, over the past 10 years. While Supernova holds a large contract with the City, this focus is on the Blighted Properties within the City limits. This project was built out of a desire from our individuals to be more involved in their local community, an interest in the landscaping field, and a need from the City to have properties that have been abandoned by their owners to be maintained and keep the City looking clean and welcoming.

Supernova Employment Specialists and individuals are given a "cut list" of properties by the City Administrator that have been identified by council. Supernova then works through the list daily. Depending on the level of maintenance the property needs, the individuals are equipped with a brush hog for initial clearing of lots, a lawnmower for maintenance after lot is cleared and a weed eater for trimming the properties. Each piece of equipment is operated by the individual under direct supervision and guidance of the Employment Specialist. This project came to life because of the desire from our individuals to be a part of bettering their community and the dedication of our Employment Specialists to take on such a labor-intensive task while also maintaining the highest quality of support for our individuals.



Employment Program Spotlight - City of Washington Blighted Properties Project (contd.)

Due to the training our individuals received while working on this project, the City has hired Joe M., a City employee dedicated to maintaining the Blighted Properties. When an issue arose at the memorial park on Sammy Angott Way, the Supernova Team didn't think twice about adding the property to their list so that the community can have a clean and maintained space to pay their respects to those memorialized there. When asked about the partnership, City Administrator Rich Cleveland said, "Supernova Services is a valuable asset to the City of Washington, providing services to clean up blighted properties, improving the quality of life for our residents". We value the partnership and are proud to play our part.

The team currently has a list of close to 20 properties so if you see them out, working to make their community just a little more inviting, give them a wave!

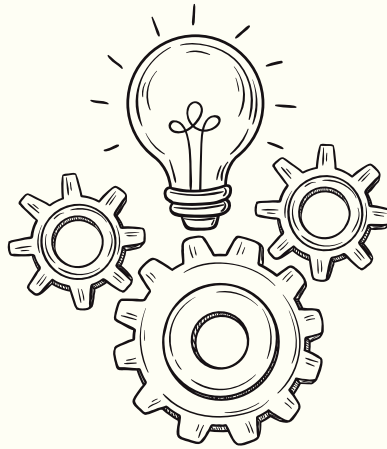
Join Our Weekly Walking Club, Paws & Paths - Now Featuring Our Furry Mascot, Cappi!
